Life Of Paul (262) Florida School of Preaching Fall Semester 2022 Course Syllabus

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Description: Paul, that universal person, commissioned with the universal gospel—what blessings await the diligent study of the life of this great apostle. Paul, born of Jewish parents and a Roman citizen; reared in the culture of the Greek and in the most strict sect of first-century Judaism—Paul, more than any other first-century person, represents what Christian fidelity demands. To understand the life of Paul is to understand Christianity, and this will be the goal of this study.

Assigned Reading — Weekly readings will be assigned and included as a portion of the grade for this class. The required readings will be taken from the required text and the literature provided by the instructor.

Course Requirements:

- A. Sermon Outlines.
 - 1. Each student will write 4 sermon outlines (all must be from the writings of Paul)
 - 2. The sermon outlines must be 3 pages in length. The first two are due October 6, 2022 (this will be your mid-term).
 - 3. The last two are due the week before finals (December 8, 2022).
- B. Research Papers.
 - 1. Each student will write a 6-8 page research paper on a Pauline subject. The paper will be in MLA format and will be turned in the week before finals.
 - 2. The research subject must be approved, by the instructor, before the commencement of work on the paper.
- C. Memory work.
 - 1. Each student will memorize, and be examined on the memory work.
 - 2. The memory work will be provided by the instructor.
 - 3. Each of these verses will come from Paul's writing.
- D. Class notes.
 - 1. Students are to take notes for personal use.
 - 2. These notes will help you once you begin your ministry. Take good notes!
- E. Each student will be required to take a final exam.
 - 1. Your remaining 2 sermon outlines and your research paper will be included in your final exam.
 - 2. You will also be required to do a written exam about the material that was covered in

class.
